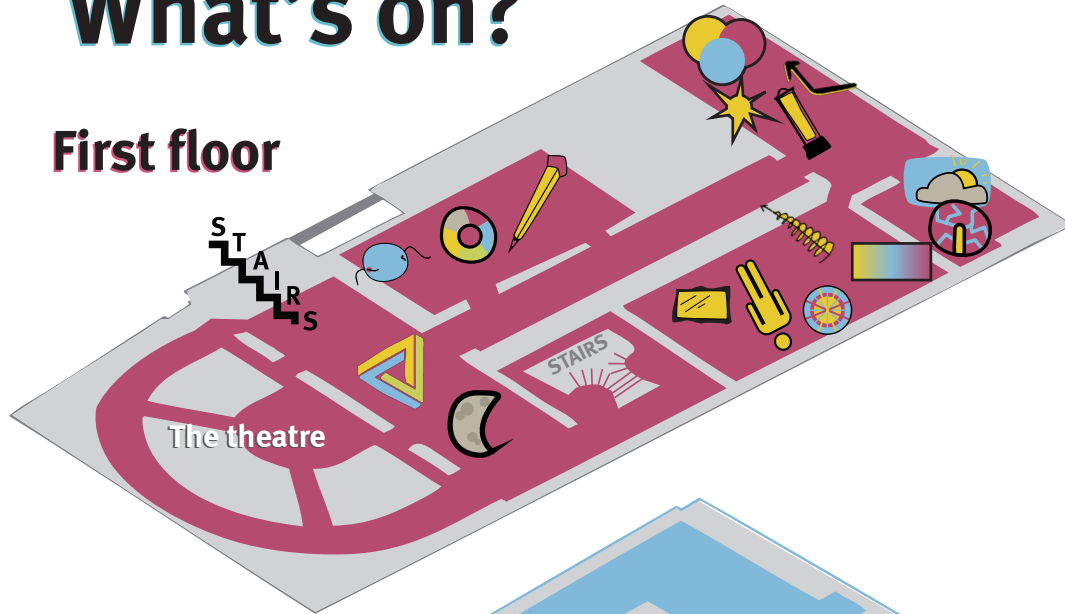

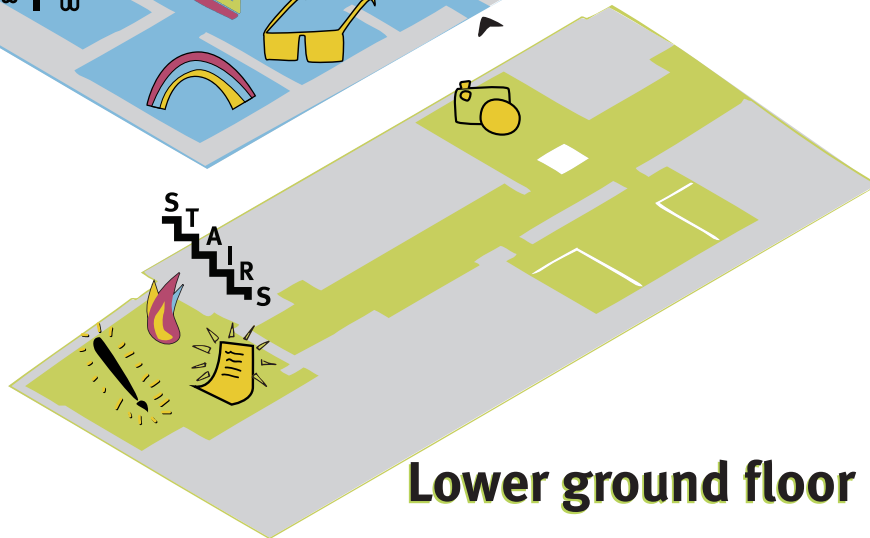
First floor
